



Tenure-Track Faculty in the Learning Sciences

Pending budgetary approval, the Colleges of Education and Engineering and Science at Louisiana Tech University anticipate jointly filling a tenure track position, commencing September 1, 2018. Primary college assignment will be determined by the successful candidate's background. To build a diverse workforce the Colleges encourage applications from individuals with disabilities, minorities, veterans and women. The University is a doctoral granting public institution that enrolls over 12,000 students from 48 states and 68 foreign countries.

Candidates must possess excellent teaching and research credentials as well as a Ph.D. in the Learning Sciences, Educational Psychology, Curriculum and Instruction or a related field by the start date. Rank and salary will be commensurate with qualifications. The successful candidate is expected to develop a cutting-edge research program, actively pursue external funding, supervise graduate students in one or more of the university's graduate programs (http://www.latech.edu/graduate_school/) and teach undergraduate and graduate courses related to the candidate's background. To foster collaboration in research and outreach, the successful candidate will be appointed to the multidisciplinary Integrated STEM Education Research Center (ISERC) and Science and Technology Education Center (SciTec).

Research strengths of particular interest include expertise in computer science education, designing and performing quantitative research studies relevant in secondary education and post-secondary education, and content pedagogy and curriculum development.
